

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Monitoring Requirements Not Met for Windstream & Carriage Subdivision

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During 2016, we did not monitor for Nitrate/ Nitrite therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time. However, we did resample on January 26, 2017 and the results show that the concentration of Nitrate 1.55 ug/L and Nitrite 0.03 ug/L is under the Maximum Contaminate Level (MCL) (Nitrate = 10 mg/L ; Nitrite = 1 mg/L).

Infants below the age of six months who drink water containing nitrate in excess of the MCL could become seriously ill and, if untreated, may die. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blue-baby syndrome.
